Will under Indian succession Act, 1925

Will

- Will means legal declaration of the intention of the testator with respect of his property which he desire's to be carried into effect after his death
- A will can be revoked any time
- Registration of will is optional

Characteristics of a will

- ◉ Legal declaration by the maker
- ◉ It relates to his property
- ◉ It must takes effect only after the death of maker
- ◉ It must be revocable during the life of time of the maker

Who can make will

- Every person of sound mind and being a Major may dispose of his property by will
- **Person incapable**
 - > Minors
 - > Lunatics
 - > Intoxicated person

Kinds of will



- ◉ **Privileged will** –Any soldier, airman, mariner, employed in the expedition, engaged in warfare who completed age of 18 years dispose the property by a will. This type will are called privileged will
- ◉ **Unprivileged will** - when the executor is any one else such will is called unprivileged will.

Codicil

Codicil

- ◉ Codicil means addition or supplement
- ◉ It modifies a will
- ◉ It is made in relation to will and explaining , altering or adding to dispositions



Revocation of will

- Cancellation of will can be made in the following situations
- Subsequent marriage of the testator
- Subsequent will or codicil
- Instrument of revocation
- Destruction of will
